Join us by sponsoring this first solar and wildlife workshop in the Southeast.

The U.S. Southeast region has experienced surging installations of large utility-scale solar

development. At the request of stakeholders in AL, FL, GA, LA, MS, and TN, REWI is facilitating this workshop. REWI is working with a Planning Committee of experts representing conservation/science organizations, industry, local, state, and federal public agencies, and other interested parties to plan and conduct the workshop. This is a hybrid workshop; registration is scheduled to open in April 2024.

Registration rates are \$150 for general and \$75 for public agencies and NGOs.

## **DISCUSSIONS WILL INCLUDE:**

- Understanding utility-scale solar development and future projections for this region
- Learning how developers identify sites, and the current state of the technology
- Reviewing the spectrum of federal, state, and local solar development laws, covering permitting, risk evaluation, and economic perspectives
- Exploring the state of science on risk and solutions to address wildlife and related natural resources challenges
- Understanding the complexities and potential growth of solar in the Southeast
- Creating a platform for problem-solving and foster improved collaboration among stakeholders
